GATHERING

Preparing for Virtual Worship

Hymn of the Day: When Morning Gilds the Skies Hymn 427

When morning gilds the skies, my heart, awaking, cries, may Jesus Christ be praised! When evening shadows fall, this rings my curfew call, may Jesus Christ be praised! When mirth for music longs, this is my song of songs: may Jesus Christ be praised! God's holy house of prayer hath none that can compare with: Jesus Christ be praised! No lovelier antiphon in all high heaven is known than, Jesus Christ be praised! There to the eternal Word the eternal psalm is heard: may Jesus Christ be praised! Sing, suns and stars of space, sing, ye that see his face, sing, Jesus Christ be praised! God's whole creation o'er, both now and evermore shall Jesus Christ be praised!

This anonymous German Catholic hymn was translated for use in English hymnals during the 19th century. It is rare for a hymn tune to be composed for a specific text, but English composer Joseph Barnby (1838-1896) wrote this music with these words in mind.

Eating Together: Suggestions for Your Table

We invite you to use this packet to deepen your home worship and provide thoughtful reflection for you and your family.

In the Gospel reading from Matthew, Jesus says, "And I tell you, you are Peter, and on this rock I will build my church, and the gates of Hades will not prevail against it." The words from *The Collect* remind us that we are together no matter our location: "that your Church, being gathered together in unity by your Holy Spirit, may show forth your power among all peoples."

Giving deeper thought to these lines reminds us of our church in the physical sense, however, as we worship outside of our building, we are called to realize that as much as we miss our physical space, we can remain together in unity wherever we are. Our faith is greater than brick and mortar and cannot be contained.

Here's a prayer you can use before dinner:

God of salvation, who sent your Son to seek out and save what is lost, hear our prayers on behalf of those who are lost in our day, receiving these petitions and thanksgivings with your unending compassion. Amen.
